

# NOTICE OF RACE

## 2007 SOUTH AUSTRALIAN HOBIE 16 CHAMPIONSHIPS

### VICTOR HARBOR YACHT CLUB

### FEBRUARY 10<sup>th</sup> AND 11<sup>th</sup> 2007

The South Australian Hobie 16 Championships will be held on the waters in the vicinity of the Victor Harbor Yacht Club on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2007.

The Organising Authority is the Victor Harbor Yacht Club in conjunction with the Hobie Cat Association of South Australia.

#### 1 RULES

- a The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- b The Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Yachting Australia Inc will apply.
- c The Class Rules of the International Hobie Class Association will apply.

#### 2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- a The regatta is open to all Hobie 16 catamarans which comply with the International Hobie Class Rules.
- b Eligible boats may enter by completing the official entry form and submitting it, together with the required fee, at the registration point at the Victor Harbor Yacht Club on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2007 by 11:30am.

#### 3 FEES

- a Entry fee is \$70.00.

#### 4 SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- a Registration: Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2007 10:00am – 11:30am.
- b Races: Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2007 First warning signal not before 12 noon.  
Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2007 First warning signal not before 10:30am.  
Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2007 No warning signal after 4:00pm.
- c BBQ: Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2007 After racing.
- d Racing will be back to back with a maximum of 4 races per day to a maximum of 7 races.

#### 5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- a The Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

#### 6 VENUE

- a The racing will be held in the waters immediately in front of the Victor Harbor Yacht Club.

#### 7 COURSES

- a The courses will be displayed on the notice board not less than 1 hour before each day's first warning signal.

#### 8 PENALTY SYSTEM

- a Rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

#### 9 SCORING

- a Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- b When fewer than four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- c When four (4) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

#### 10 BUOYANCY

- a All competitors shall wear, whilst afloat, an approved personal flotation device which is in good condition and is in accordance with the specifications issued or approved by a national authority affiliated to the International Sailing Federation, or standards organisation, or certification authority, recognised for the purpose by its respective government.

#### 11 PRIZES

- a Prizes will be awarded for first, second and third places. The Organising Committee may award additional prizes.
